

Guidance on how to update a consumer battery charger model already certified to MAEDBS with data provided from a re-test to the new test procedure.

Certifiers may use the “CHANGE” (‘C’) action code to update models of consumer battery chargers previously certified to the California Energy Commission under the January 1, 2016, test procedure to indicate that the model is now tested to the new, June 20, 2016, test procedure for consumer battery chargers issued by the U.S. Department of Energy <https://www.regulations.gov/document?D=EERE-2014-BT-TP-0044-0023>.

Log into your MAEDBS user account and, under the Applications tab, select the Submit Appliance Data function. To update the listing of a consumer battery charger model with data derived from the June 20, 2016, test procedure and that was previously certified to the database under the January 1, 2016, test procedure, use the ‘Change’ action from the drop-down ‘Action’ field.

- Key in appliance data according to associated fields in the import template provided in the instructions for this specific appliance type. If the appliance brand name does not appear in the dropdown, enter it in the free entry field, this will be added to the system after CEC staff processing.
- Model data must first be processed by CEC prior to any submissions to change or delete previously submitted model data.
- **Brand codes are not accepted.**
