The California Energy Commission is looking for a qualified candidate for the Siting, Transmission and Environmental Protection (STEP) division to help shape California's critical energy future. The STEP division ensures that energy facilities are authorized in an expeditious, safe and environmentally acceptable manner. We prepare environmental documentation for the Commission as required by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). To attain our objectives, the division maintains a committed and creative staff of experts in more than 20 environmental and engineering disciplines. The division's range of technical expertise allows it to perform balanced independent evaluations of complex and controversial projects. If energy is your passion, or if you feel compelled to help mold our energy infrastructure for a renewable future, then we encourage you to apply.

DUTIES/RESPONSIBILITIES: Under the general direction of the Cultural Resources Unit Supervisor/Commission Tribal Liaison, the Planner II – EFS will independently perform consultations, research, and related technical analyses for the most complex energy facility siting projects and planning studies in the area of cultural resources, including tribal cultural resources as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act. The Planner II may also act as a working team leader or as a lead person over a group of technical specialists or on the most complex projects, work independently as a tribal subject-matter expert to formulate and develop solutions to extremely difficult problems.

DESIRABLE EXPERIENCE/QUALIFICATIONS: The successful applicant should have experience in cultural resources fieldwork, and objective review of complex studies related to the survey, discovery, analysis and mitigation for the potential impacts of energy facility development on tribal cultural resources and related tribal communities. The applicant should have working knowledge of tribal government affairs and be comfortable interacting in diverse tribal forums and knowledge of the California Public Resources Code pertaining to energy conservation and development, the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and federal, tribal, state, and local government laws, ordinances, regulations and standards pertaining to energy development, environmental protection, and tribal affairs. The successful applicant must have the ability to analyze complex data and to prepare and present complex and comprehensive reports and recommendations orally and in writing, as well as the ability to analyze situations accurately and take effective action. The incumbent should possess knowledge of environmental issues associated with energy production and use in California and energy facility siting, legal requirements protecting cultural resources, and mitigation techniques to prevent significant impacts. While not required, it is desirable that the successful candidate meet the professional

qualifications standards of the US Secretary of Interior for a cultural resources specialist. The incumbent must have the ability and flexibility to travel and effectively participate in site visits, tribal meetings, public workshops and hearings.

WHO MAY APPLY: Eligible candidates who are current state employees with status in the above classification, lateral transfers from an equivalent class who meet the minimum qualifications of this classification, former state employees who can reinstate into this class or persons who are reachable on a current employment list for this classification. Appointment is subject to the provisions of the SROA process: SROA/SURPLUS/ REEMPLOYMENT candidates are encouraged to apply and must attach a copy of their status letter in order to be considered. Applications will be screened and the most qualified may be contacted for an interview.

Interested applicants must submit a completed Standard State Application (Form STD. 678) with an original signature, to the contact/address listed below. Electronic applications will not be accepted. **Clearly indicate the basis of your eligibility (i.e., list, transfer, SROA/Surplus, reinstatement, etc.), RPA #760-327 and Position #760-4756-084 in the “Explanation Section” of the STD. 678.**
