Section 3.2: Specific description of the payment and its agency purpose and use.

On November 8th, 2017 Matt Coldwell, Advisor to Commissioner Janea A. Scott at the California Energy Commission will participate at the Center for the New Energy Economy's (CNEE) *Repowering the Western Economy* meeting in Tempe, Arizona. CNEE has been facilitating a multi-state dialogue to identify the key challenges facing the electricity sector in the West and how to address those challenges through enhanced regional coordination and state policy.
